Welcome back to school everyone! I hope that you have had a fun-filled, relaxing summer and that you are now ready for a great school year at Haldane.

Classroom Assignments

The staff spent a significant amount of time placing children in classes, taking advice from last year's teacher and inviting parent input as to the social, emotional and educational needs of each child. However, we may need to make minor adjustments to class lists based on those students who have left Haldane or others who have just registered. Students will start the week working in grade groups and we hope to have classes completed and transition students into their classes by Friday afternoon.

Please note: Preparing classes for dismissal can sometimes extend beyond the 2:40 bell. Parents are asked to remain outside of the building or quietly wait in the foyer until the 2:40 bell to prevent distraction in the hallways which can make prompt dismissal even more difficult. Thanks for your understanding.

Medical Alerts & Administration of Medication

Parents, please remember that is your responsibility to let the school know if your child has a serious health condition or requires medication while at school. School district personnel are not permitted to administer medication to students unless specifically authorized to do so by a Doctor. Please ensure you obtain a form/s from us that authorize the school to administer a prescription or identify the steps to take in a medical emergency. All medication must be clearly labelled with your child's name, the medications name and given to the teacher as soon as the classes begin for the day. School staff is not permitted to administer non-prescription drugs (ie: aspirin) at any time. If your child has an epipen, we need one in the office at all times.

Student Drop off and Pick up Areas

Please note that the parking lot is for School District #73 personnel only.

NO DROP OFF OR PICK UP IN THE PARKING LOT
Student safety is of utmost importance to all of us. Please ensure that you review safety rules with your child regarding walking on sidewalks, looking before they cross the street, etc. Also, if you are driving your child to school, please obey all signs in drop off and pick up areas. We will be patrolling our parking lot for the first few days to ensure that all students use the side walkways on either side of the parking lot to get to the school grounds. We do not want students walking through the parking lot behind cars for obvious safety reasons. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Transportation

- 1. School bus/walk limit policy to schools is in effect in all areas of School District #73:
 - a. Primary students, K to Grade 3: 4 km or 2.5 miles to a school, and 3.2 km or 2 miles to a bus stop
 - b. All other students, Grade 4-12: 4.8 km or 3 miles to a school, and 3.2 km or 2 miles to a bus stop
- 2. Bus pupils who do not register within the first week of school opening and who do not remain riding the bus, are subject to losing the privilege of a school bus ride for the entire 2016/2017 school term.
- 3. All bus schedules are subject to change in the course of the school year as a result of traffic patterns, weather conditions and population density.

Please remember that everyone entering the school needs to sign in and out at the front desk. There is a blue binder labelled Sign In Sheet on the front counter.

Secwepmec Language

A permission slip regarding the Shuswap Language program which is taught by Ms Chelsea will be going home this week. Your child will need to return this form by September 15th if you wish for them to participate.

Aboriginal Programs and Services

Forms will be coming home later this week. Please sign and return the confirmation form regarding Aboriginal ancestry as soon as possible.

Milk Program

We will be offering milk 3 times a week, Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The cost for a card is \$20 and will allow students to purchase 18 milks. The card will be kept by the teacher in the child's classroom. Milk card purchase forms can be picked up from the office.

Young Peoples' Concert

This year students in grades K-7 will once again participate in the Young Peoples' Concerts program. Each student will be attending one performance at the Sagebrush Theatre in Kamloops over the course of the year. In addition, the school will be hosting concerts locally (in the school gym). We will be sending home more information soon. The cost of this program is \$15 per student and is included in the student supply fee.

VOLUNTEERS

Yes, volunteers are welcome at the school. Volunteers are encouraged to come. We need helpers in the classrooms, in the Library, helpers with the One to One Reading Program, participate on field trips and other areas. Please contact your child's teacher or the school office if you want to volunteer. Volunteers must be aware that they may be obligated to have a criminal reference check completed at the local RCMP detachment. Criminal record checks are valid for 3 years.

Breakfast Program

We are fortunate to have a Breakfast Program at Haldane Elementary and we invite children to participate. The program will begin on Monday, September 26th in the Multipurpose Room. Students will enter through the front doors starting at just before 8:00am. Thank you to Mrs. Terry Chinnock & Ms. Kieran Chinnock for operating this wonderful program for us again this year.

To become part of the Breakfast Program, students need to return a consent form along with payment. The consent form along with more detailed information will be coming home in the next few days.
